Program Admissions Criteria

Applicants are evaluated on the following criteria:

- Master’s Degree required;
 - Health care related field or public health background preferred
 - Regionally accredited institution
- Master’s Degree GPA > 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- No GRE required for admission.
